Highgate will again take donations at the Esplanade Train station/Busport location -





We say "VALE" to two of our Stalwarts

Few Highgate members are left who Australia, who joined the 2nd AIF in 1940 when the Netherlands was bombed. He was a Commando in 2/4th Independent Company. He later transferred to "Z Force" during which some intrepid raids were taken on Royal Neth-



erlands Navy Subs 021 and K15. Post-WW2, he devoted 40 years as a teacher and Principal in WA schools. Rest in Peace Ernst - you earned it. * * * Likewise, our hearts go out to the family of Peter Hummerston, who has just died after some months of illness. Peter joined the Air Force in 1941, becoming a Wireless Op/Air Gunner, and later a Navigator.



He served with 36 Sqn, flying Dakotas: throughout the South West Pacific on : many varied missions. Flying over New Guinea in those days, in the unarmed, unescorted Dakotas - erratic weather as a constant hazard, was a risky business. When discharged in 1945, he'd flown 84 supply dropping missions and over 1400 hours. Peter gave a LOT to Highgate.

"The Way We Were" Gallery Our Golden Oldies

Many of our members might recall when one of our own: Kevin Graham, delivered an interesting Luncheon talk one day, about ONE of his "post-service" careers - as a Celebrant for Marriages and Funerals. Quite a dramatic switch for a bloke who had previously been an Army plumber and gas fitter, PTI and then Ordnance/Ammunition expert!! Our Kevin, in his quiet way, is a man of multiple talents and accomplishments!

A "dinky-di" West Aussie from his birth in 1936 - at least in the early days! - he attended South Perth Primary and then Guildford Grammar until, at the tender age of 15 years and one month, he was enlisted/accepted into the Army Apprentice School, Balcombe (Vic) for his trade training. He was so slight and small in stature that he had to have his Battle Dress and Blues Ceremonial uniforms tailor-made. It was six months before he had a real uniform to wear! Just a kid really how many of us would allow our barely fifteen-year-old offspring to join the Army!!

But this was a youngster made of "stern stuff!" After graduation, Kevin was posted to 23 Construction Sqn (Warradale, S.A.) He then transferred to regimental duties as an instructor at 16 NS Trg Bn (Woodside, S.A.), and then to the School of Military Engineering (Casula, NSW) as a Physical Training Instructor. Kevin was accepted into the Officer Cadet School, Portsea, Vic) in early 1958, graduating the following January.

In 1960, he got a Corps transfer to the Royal Australian Army Ordnance Corps (RAAOC), and thenceforth began his long career in the technology and management of ammunition - with various courses and postings in that field. In March 1965, he commenced a two year posting as Staff Capt (Q) at HQ PNG Command in Port Moresby - remembered fondly as "my best posting!" In September, 1968, Kevin was posted to HQ Australian Force in Vietnam - but after six months, in quite a nasty ammunition demolition accident, he was quite seriously injured and burnt, necessitating being Medevac'd back to Australia.

Several admin and training posts followed before a lovely little pick-me-up - not without its own nice dollop of "glamour": an 18-month enjoyable posting to undergo further training in the UK, Canada and the USA. Thereafter further postings to AHQ in Canberra and the relatively benign (and safer!) world of clothing and General Stores Development.

Kevin was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel in 1978 whilst serving at 21 Supply Bn, Moorebank (NSW). He then went back to South Australia for a spell (CO 4 Army Quality UA), and retired in January 1980, after 28 fruitful years, of which only three were spent in his home state of WA.

On returning to civvy life, Kevin became the first Executive Officer of the WA Sports Federation at Perry Lakes for over two years before he resigned to study for a degree at UWA. He then took a job as State Secretary of the Royal WA Bowling Association - a position he held for five years, before being appointed Executive Officer of the WA Licensed Clubs Association for a four year stint.

In 1995, he became Honorary Colonel RAAOC. On presenting at the Clothing Store, he once again found the Army could not produce a uniform to fit him, so once again he had to wait for a "made-to-measure". As he says: "Seems nothing changes - except, maybe, waist-lines!" He handed over to Lt Col Vic Hayes in 2002.

Coming from farming stock, Kevin retains a lively interest in vegetable gardening - successfully too. He is still a member of the North Cottesloe Surf Life Saving Club, and tries to visit the gym and take a swim most days. All the better since you've had your lovely, "new" knees Kevin!

Living in Nedlands and only about 400 metres from Karrakatta Cemetery, Kevin has a very genuine interest in conducting meaningful funerals as a celebrant - especially for anyone who has had military service. He also lives quite close to Hollywood Hospital, gladly and generously serving our Sub-Branch wherever possible as a Hospital Visitor - for which we express our warmest thanks Kevin. Kevin is married to Jan - and he has a daughter and granddaughter who live in Margaret River.

He's a modest, unassuming sort of chap, but don't be fooled: he's a bit of a GUN!

THE WORLD'S LAST SURVIVING "MEPHISTO" TANK COMES TO THE AUSTRALIAN WAR MEMORIAL

A unique exhibit is currently capturing the attention of visitors to Canberra's Australian War Memorial. On loan from the Queensland Museum for the next 18 months, the displayed item is a very rare World War I German tank that has aroused a lot of interest amongst tank and armoured warfare *aficionados*.

Germany produced only 20 of their A7V Sturmpanzerwagens to take part in WWI, but they engendered considerable fear and respect in Australian troops, who at the time considered them to be "state-of-the-art". Nonetheless members of the 26th Battalion AIF courageously managed to capture one of them - known as "Mephisto" - in 1918, after it had become bogged and stuck in a hole. It was later brought back to Australia - and is now the last remaining tank of its kind in the world.

The tanks were cramped, hot and noisy, making it an unpleasant experience for the crews on board, which could be up to 26 men at a time. For many German tank crews, painting decorations on their tank was a form of both enjoyment and a way of making their tank distinguishable from others in the fleet. This one bears a de-

piction of Mephistopheles, the red, smiling Faustian demon - hence its name.

AVM director: Dr Brendan Nelson said bringing the tank to Canberra would allow more Australians to learn about tank warfare in WWI and the engineering side of German tanks. "The introduction of this tank into warfare when the Germans did it in 198 had the potential to be a significant game changer." he said.

Transporting the tank to Canberra was no easy feat. Mephisto had to be wrapped using lankets and sheets of

plastic before being transported by road for the journey south, which happened over the course of a weekend.

Upon arrival in Canberra, the difficult process of setting the exhibit up began. Two cranes were required to move the tank from th truck to a custom-made trolley which not only allowed for easy transfer into Anzac Hall, but provides a base for it during its time in Canberra.

Anyone planning to take a trip to our national capital in months to come, should call in and take a look!
