MARGOT HARNESS

As the President has noted, from time to time we introduce members of the Committee so that you may have a better understanding of those who represent you. Margot is the first lady to have served on the Committee.

In an uncharacteristic way for the female gender she has told us that she was born on 6 Oct 1944. She was raised in various towns in country Victoria. She is the eldest of six children. Her father

served for six years in the 2nd AIF (2/5th Inf Battalion). Margot joined the WRANS in March 1962 in which she served for four years as a Radio Operator/Cryptographer. She worked on the Queen's communications team during the 1964 Royal visit and for the next 16 months was employed as a teleprinter op/secretary. She then worked in NZ as a secretary.

In April 1967 Margot enlisted in the Australian Army (WRAAC) as a direct entry Officer Cadet. She served 4.4 years as Staff officer; left with the rank of Captain. In 1968 during a posting to IRTB she met and married then F/O Mike HARNESS who had been posted to RAAF Base, Forest Hill, outside Wagga Wagga, after his return from SVN.

After her service career Margot acknowledged the title of Air Force "wife" for 17 years plus being a Mum of two daughters. She had various part time jobs (medical secretary; managed small Credit Union offices and provincial newspaper reporter).

Margot and Mike moved to WA in 1985 after Mike left the RAAF. They ran a newsagency for five years, then the family travelled the world for five months. Margot Started work at ANZAC House in 1990 as State Secretary to Aust Vietnam War Veterans' Trust Committee (which regulated dispersal of "Agent Orange" money to Vietnam Veterans in financially needy circumstances). In 1993 the RSL offered her the position of Pensions Officer, followed by the position of Senior Advocate.

During the 1990's she attended University part time, graduating with a Bachelor of Psychology degree.

In 2005 she resigned her position with the RSL after her husband was diagnosed with cancer for the third time. Margot is now a volunteer Advocate for RSL and involved in Advocacy training and on State Vet Affairs Committee. She has served for years as an active volunteer for the Red Cross, RAAF Women's Association, School P&F/tuckshops etc. and church work. Hobbies and Interests are travel, reading, music and cryptic crosswords.

Margot's contribution to the Highgate Sub-Branch and to the RSL is substantial and it is a real pleasure to have her as a fellow committee member.

Long may she be with us.

We have much for which to thank him. He was an outstanding soldier and a great West Australian. His service to the community has been recognised by the award of "Member of the Order of Australia" (AM), Life Membership of the RSL, the Meritorious Medal and 50 years of Service Certificate. But, this public acknowledgement can not tell the full story, of the influence and of the guidance and friendship, that has been bestowed on all those who have been fortunate enough to have known him.

As a Warden of the State War Memorial Ron was involved in its recent restoration and as a Committee Member of the RSL War Veterans Homes and later Trustee he helped guide it to the contemporary, inviting and vital facility that it is today.

Ron was laid to rest on Tuesday 29 May 2007 following a moving and solemn ceremony in the Jewish section of Karrakatta Cemetery. Stirring eulogies acknowledging Ron's contributions to the veteran community and many others were presented by Rabbi Coleman and Bill Gaynor.

The esteem in which Ron was held by the community at large was amply evidenced by the large number who accompanied him to his final resting place.

Ron, know that all of us who have been in your company, are indebted to you.


