
exciting plans in the pipeline so watch this space.

Editorial

The hottest topic for years, global warming and its stated effects on the climate, has received the coldest of shoulders in the current election campaign. It is just too difficult and its vote catching appeal is questionable, hence its neglect. And yet it remains a source of great concern. Is it any wonder that many of us view our politicians with cynicism.

Internationally, global warming remains a hot topic especially now that there is, a further contrary view to the popular one that the warming is due to human activities. This again puts the cat among the pigeons. The following is an extract from a recent report by Tom Feilden, Science Correspondent for the BBC Today programme.

(The Global warming narrative - that mankind's addiction to burning fossil fuels is rapidly changing the climate - may be about to go seriously off message.

Far from suggesting the planet will be warmer, one of the world's leading climate modellers says the latest data indicates we could be in for a significant period of steady temperatures and possibly even a little global cooling.

Professor Mojib Latif, from the Leibniz Institute of Marine Sciences at Kiel University in Germany has been looking at the influence of cyclical changes to ocean currents and temperatures in the Atlantic, a feature known as the North Atlantic Oscillation . When he factored these natural fluctuations into his global climate model, Professor Latif found the results would bring the remorseless rise in average global temperatures to an abrupt halt.

"The strong warming effect that we experienced during the last decades will be interrupted. Temperatures

will be more or less steady for some years, and thereafter will pickup again and continue to warm".

With apologies to Al Gore, Professor Latif's finding is something of an 'inconvenient truth' for the global warming debate. And the timing couldn't be much worse. World leaders are due to meet in Copenhagen in December to hammer out an agreement on cutting greenhouse gas emissions to replace the Kyoto Treaty. It certainly won't help if there are a couple of inches of snow on the ground outside the convention centre, and climate models are predicting a sustained period of steady, or even falling, global temperatures.)

Climate sceptics have been around for a long time now and are regularly berated and or ridiculed for the views they hold. The sceptics in Government have been long silenced by the fear that the ridicule will stick and their assessment will cost them votes. It is a humiliation that opposing views, on this topic, cannot be debated in parliament and, maybe, also within the wider community. It is only by discussion in a reasoned and calm manner, without the harassment and belittling of the considerable majority who have accepted that the damage is the product of our excesses, will we reach a considered decision.

We are probably not going to hear a lot more on this topic during the election campaign but there is little doubt that we are in for some mud slinging and many promises in the weeks leading up to the Federal Election.

Oh! could it be but different.
