The financial report has been prepared for distribution to members for the purpose of fulfilling the financial reporting requirements under the Association's constitution. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

My audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. My procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report and significant accounting estimates. procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with accounting policies described in Note I to the financial report. These policies do not require the application of all Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements. The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the

above basis.

Qualification

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for The Returned & Services League Of Australia WA Branch (Inc) Highgate Sub Branch to maintain an effective system of internal control over donations, subscriptions and other fund raising activities until their entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, my audit in relation to these activities was limited to the amounts recorded.

Qualified Audit Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had the limitations discussed in the qualification paragraph not existed, the financial report of The Returned & Services League Of Australia WA Branch (Inc) Highgate Sub Branch is properly drawn up so as to present fairly the financial position of The Returned & Services League Of Australia WA Branch (Inc) Highgate Sub Branch as at 30 June 2010 and the results of its operations and cash flows for the year ended 30 June 2010 in accordance with the accounting policies.

BRITAIN AT WAR WITH GERMANY—GUILDFORD WA'S CONTRIBUTION

ust after midnight on 5 August 1914, the Governor General of Australia was notified that Britain was at war with Germany. The following day, the British Government accepted Australia's offer of 20,000 volunteer fighters, asking for them to be despatched as soon as possible, and the Australian Imperial Force (AIF) was born. The Governor General replied, "There is indescribable enthusiasm and entire unanimity throughout Australia in support of all that tends to provide for the security of the Empire in war." Western Australia was expected to raise 1,004 volunteers who would be guaranteed pensions and compensated for wounds.

Recruiting offices opened on 10th August and within days thousands of men had responded to the call. Enlistment was regarded as a particularly good opportunity for unemployed men who had been adversely affected by drought in farming areas and the end of the gold rushes. Although the majority of young Guildford men had been unaf-

fected by these hardships, they were just as keen to take advantage of the opportunity for travel and adventure and to prove their bravery and devotion to the British Empire as those who had few other prospects.

The 37th and 38th Field Artillery units were grouped together and designated the 8th Field Artillery Battery under the command of Major Bessel-Brown, a New Zealander and decorated veteran of the Boer War. Alfred Joseph Bessel-Brown, who would move family from Caversham to Guildford in 1919, had commanded the 37th Field Artillery Battery since 1911. All his men volunteered to enlist at once. The men who trained at the Remount Depot in South Guildford were among the first Australian soldiers to fight at Gallipoli . Men who wanted to enlist in the Light Horse regiment were asked to bring their horses, which the government bought for sixteen pounds each. While approval had been given to raise Western Australian troops for the 7th Light Horse Regiment's C Squadron, the tremendous response led to the formation of the 10th Light Horse Regiment instead.

The first volunteers from Western Australia left Fremantle on the 2nd of November 1914, joining the convoy of ships which had amassed at Albany, en route to Egypt, where the men were trained before being sent to Gallipoli. Guildford's first casualty died in Egypt. Former Guildford State School pupil Thomas Henley Godley, who enlisted in September 1914 as a sapper with the 2nd Field Company Engineers, died from measles and pneumonia on 18th March 1915.

At least 13 young men from the Guildford district died in Gallipoli.
