GUEST SPEAKER - Dr. Lynton Hayes Beacon (UWA) MPub Admin. PhD (Indiana Uni. USA)

TOPIC - "Why is America turning to the Right with Ronald Reagan".

GUEST SPEAKER: Dr. Hayes is a Western Australian who has recently been appointed Executive Director of the Australian Institute of Management - W.A. Division Inc. He has completed the recent 10 years of his career life in the United States. His experiences include administration, leadership, instruction and research in Universities and broad association with government and industry in the States of Indiana, Florida and Colorado.

Lynton completed his Bachelor of Economics at the University of Western Australia and his Master of Public Administration and Ph.D. at Indiana University in the United States.

While abroad Lynton has been the recipient of the American Council on Education's prestigious ACE Fellowship. The Fellowship enabled him to experience a full year as an apprentice President of an American University, the first Australian to receive the honour. The year was spent with the Chancellor, University of Colorado, the Director of the Western Australian Institute of Technology and the President of the University of West Florida. He has received awards from the Rockefeller Foundation, National Science Foundation, Outstanding Young Men of America and has been a consultant to the Johnson Foundation, U.S. Council on Radioactive Waste Management, the first North American Conference on Energy and Federalism, the Southern States Energy Board and Conoco Oil. He has published two books in the United States on the subjects of energy policy, fossilfuel development and economic growth, and policy making for natural resources. He has a forthcoming book underway on radioactive waste management, risk-taking in industrial societies, and public The book will be published in the United States.

Lynton and his wife Shannon have three young children and live in City Beach.
