# THE SPEAKER.

Those Highgate members serving as Sub Wardens at a RAN Service of Remembrance some months ago were much impressed by and much taken with the Padre conducting the Service. Those present considered he would be an ideal guest whom we should invite to speak at one of our luncheons - sometimes easier said than done!

Captain Robert Belleville is from an entirely army orientated family. He broke with family tradition by embarking on a naval career during which he rose through the ranks to serve with distinction and command four different Destroyers and subsequently a Squadron of thirty Destroyers. After 38 years of service he retired from the US Navy to become a Priest and has since devoted that second career to service with Seamens' Missions. Currently the Assistant Port Chaplain at Fremantle he is based at the Flying Angel Club (The Mission to Seamen and British Sailors' Society) and we are delighted to welcome him to our luncheon shortly before his tour of duty expires in December of this year.

Dr Douglas Sutherland-Bruce gave us a fascinating and at times amusing glimpse into the evolution of Heraldry. A rather belated welcome to Mr R.S. JONES, who joined 3 months ago but owing to a tactical blunder was left off the mailing list. has now been remedied.

Unfortunately a sad farewell to two members, FRED ELLIOT and LEN READING, who passed away in September.

Fred, who was the father of long-standing Past Treasurer Bob Elliot, was born in South Australia in 1893. As one of 10 children he moved with his family to Kalqoorlie in 1903. He enlisted in the 51st Bn. A.I.F. in the 1914-18 war and served in Egypt and France, where he was severely wounded, repatriated to Australia, and subsequently discharged He was employed by Boan Bros. for many years, but before retirement he was for 20 years the Accountant for United Motors. A long-time member of the South Perth Sub-Branch of the R.S.L., Fred transferred to Highgate when son Bob retired so that they could attend the monthly luncheons together. Active almost until the end, Fred passed away in his 96th year.

Len joined the Royal Engineers as a boy apprentice and retired as a Lt. Colonel 41 years later. No mean feat. Stationed in Singapore at the onset of the 1939-45 conflict, he met Marie, living with

her parents on the Island, and just before capitulation they were married. Two hours later the new Mrs Reading left on one of the last boats to reach safety. Len spent the rest of the war in Changi, and after release was Mentioned in Despatches and received many commendations for his abilities in orangising construction work to make the life of the prisoners more tolerable. On retiring from the Army he entered the civilian construction industry in Britain and Canada before settling in Perth. Here he was involved in the building of the Art Gallery and the Fremantle Hospital Extension. A comparative new member of Highgate, he was a regular attender at the Luncheons and enjoyed the company of friends he met there. At his request Ex-servicemen, including 3 from Highgate, acted as Pall Bearers together with friends from Probus. Len passed away just before what would have been his 76th birthday.
