SUBJECT:

"Some Background to the Present Polish Situation"

This month's speaker has been a member of Highgate for nearly 10 years. He is currently a Senior Lecturer in Mechanical Engineering at Curtin University. He is also the President of the Polish Ex-servicemen's Association, WA Branch. His war service includes the Warsaw Uprising in 1944 and a 6 month POW spell in Germany. Later he served with the Polish II Corps in Italy and UK. He came to WA from UK in 1968.

Events in Poland continue to receive a lot of exposure in the media. Poland can be said to have spearheaded the disintegration of Communism. Recent developments there are not only perplexing but also unprecedented. A glimpse at some specific episodes, which occurred during our own lifetime, as well as in more ancient history, may shed some light on the Polish situation as it unfolds today. Poland with its population of 38 million at home and an estimated 15 million scattered worldwide, will continue to be a significant factor in the Central European area.
