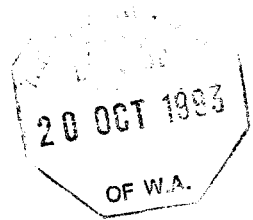

SPEAKER: Professor A R H Cole, B.S.C. D Phil. D Sc. Subject - Chemistry For The Citizen.

Professor Cole was educated at Perth Modern School and obtained his degree at the University of Western Australia and at Oxford University.

He is a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Science as well as the Royal Australian Chemical Institute. He has held positions on committees of several scientific organisations.

At the time of his retirement in 1989 as Professor of Chemistry, he was Head of the Department of Chemistry at UWA.

What better qualifications could there be for a speaker on "Chemistry for the Citizen"?
