SUBJECT: Sailing in Western Australia


THANKYOU:

VALE: LEON VERDI GOLDSWORTHY G.C. D.S.C. G.M. 19.1.1909-7.8.1994

Was born at Broken Hill, NSW, educated at the Adelaide School of Mines and Adelaide University, graduating as an engineer. Goldie volunteered for service with the Navy, Army and Air Force at the outbreak of War but was rejected by all three services as not being tall enough. In 1940 he reapplied and was commissioned as acting Sub Lieutenant in the RANVR.

He was sent to the UK and appointed to the Rendering Mines Safe section of the Admiralty. He soon demonstrated extraordinary skill in the delousing of



He was awarded the George Medal in April 44; in August of the same year he was M.I.D. and a month later received the George Cross. His last award was the Distinguished Service Cross, award in January 45. In addition he received a letter of appreciation from Winston Churchill and was presented to F/M Montgomery, Dwight Eisenhower and Lord Louis Mountbatten(services rendered to the Allies).
