NOTES ON FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DATED 31ST. DECEMBER 1994

ACCUMULATED FUNDS - Increased by \$967 during 1994, mainly due to an increase in Welfare Funds of \$735 and the fact that our donation in 1993 of \$2000 to the War Veterans' Home Appeal was not repeated in 1994. It should be noted that our funds were down by \$665 at 31/12/93, so our position overall has improved by \$1632.

<u>INVESTED FUNDS</u> - Now stand at \$2102. Since we wrote off, in 1993, the sum of \$554 owing to us by the Permanent Building Society, we have received a small additional dividend of \$63-85, and we understand that a further small dividend (probably final) will be paid to us in 1995.

INTEREST RECEIVED - Again substantially down, from \$272 to \$185, With an increase in our interest-bearing funds, together with our term deposit having been re-negotiated at a more favourable rate, we should expect an improvement in this area.

FUNCTIONS - There was an overall shortfall of \$130, compared with a small profit shown last year. Additional guests account for this.

NEWSLETTER - Costs exceeded income by \$1074. It is expected that the increase in the Newsletter subscription will help a little towards reducing this deficiency.

<u>POPPY DAY</u> - Collections this year jumped from \$3071 in 1993 (our share \$1297) to \$5623 in 1994 (our share \$2553). That is, the benefit to our Welfare funds in 1994 was \$1256 better than in 1993. This has been attributed variously to the increased patronage of the new busport, to the fact that our collection was held on Remembrance Day, to the improving economy, but mainly to the fact that we had a very good turn-out of volunteer collectors.

<u>DONATIONS</u> - These are virtually the same as last year. It will be noted that donations form an important part of our income, and so are very much appreciated. Our income from subscriptions (\$6556 less capitation fees \$5024) amounted to only \$1532 in 1994.

LUNCHEONS - Shortfalls on two occasions cost us \$46. This could be considered reasonable.

WELFARE ACCOUNT - This fund increased by \$735, \$51 less than in 1993. Although our income from poppy sales was much better than in 1993, additional donations paid out more than offset this gain.

 $\frac{\text{HONOUR AVENUE}}{\text{year.}}$ - Last year's surplus of \$245 was reduced to \$27 this year. Contributions and donations were down by \$436, offset to some extent by reduced operation and administration costs.
