SUBJECT: PERTH'S EARLY WATER SUPPLIES.

HAROLD WAS BORN AT COTTESLOE AND EDUCATED AT GERALDTON , FERTH MODERN AND THE UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA. HE PRACTICED AS A CIVIL ENGINEER AND ADVOCATE DURING HIS WORKING LIFE.

HAROLD, WHO IS A MEMBER OF OUR SUB-BRANCH, WAS, BEFORE HIS RETIREMENT, CHIEF ENGINEER OF THE METROPOLITAN WATER BOARD (NOW THE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN WATER AUTHORITY). A MAJOR TASK WHICH HE HAS ACCOMPLISHED SINCE RETIRING HAS BEEN THE COMPILATION OF A SPECIAL REPORT FOR THE "AUSTRALIAN HERITAGE ENGINEERING RECORD" ON THE EVENTS THAT BROUGHT SAFE DRINKING WATER TO THE METROPOLITAN AREA. THIS REPORT WAS PRINTED UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE INSTITUTION OF THE ENGINEERS AUSTRALIA WA DIVISION BY ITS ENGINEERING HERITAGE SUB-COMMITTEE.

DURING HIS WAR SERVICE WITH THE ROYAL AUSTRALIAN ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL ENGINEERS BETWEEN 1941 AND 1945 HE HELD A NUMBER OF STAFF APPOINTMENTS.

TOWARDS THE END OF THE COLONIAL PERIOD THE MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS OF PERIH COMPLAINED OF A "DULL APATHETIC INERTIA OF IGNORANCE" AS THEY TRIED TO CONVINCE THE AUTHORITIES OF LINK BETWEEN CONTAMINATED DRINKING WATERS AND ENDEMIC DISEASE SUCH AS TYPHOID. IN THE 1880's, GOVERNOR ORD, A FORMER ROYAL ENGINEER OFFICER, WAS EXHORTED BY THE COLONIAL OFFICE TO "USE YOUR BEST EFFORTS TO REMEDY A CONDITION OF THINGS LITTLE CREDITABLE TO THE COLONY". THE REST IS "HISTORY" AND FORMS THE BASIS OF HAROLD'S TALK.

LAST MONTH'S SPEAKER: OUR THANKS GO OUT TO ALLAN ELLIOTT, GENERAL MANAGER OF THE ROYAL AUSTRALIAN AIR FORCE ASSOCIATION FOR HIS EXCELLENT DISSERTATION ON THE EFFORTS BEING EXPENDED BY THAT ORGANISATION TO PROVIDE ACCOMMODATION AT BULL CREEK AND MERRIWA PRIMARILY FOR RETIRED VETERANS. ### Veterans' Affairs - News Update

### VETERANS' ADVICE NETWORK (VAN)

The Veterans' Advice Network (VAN) is an information and advisory service for veterans, war widows and their family. To use VAN's services you do not need a DVA pension or health care entitlement. VAN staff will answer questions about benefits and services available through DVA. Van will also provide you with up to date information and advice about services available in your local community. You can contact VAN by telephoning the enquiry service on (09) 3668444 or by visiting the Department. DVA is now located in the AMP building on the corner of St George's Terrace and

The VAN enquiry counter is on the 12th floor. William Street, Perth.

### Veterans' Home Maintenance Helpline

Some members of the veteran community need access to home maintenance services to enable them to continue living in their own home. In recognition of this, the Department of Veterans' Affairs has arranged a Veterans' Home Maintenance Helpline which commenced on 4 April 1995.

### Helpline provides:

- advice and information on home maintenance matters, including referrals to trades people (from 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday)
- referral to a reasonably priced Home Inspection Service (from 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday)
- advice and referrals to trades people for home emergencies, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The matters you may need to phone about could range from replacing a fuse to installing a new bathroom. For large or small jobs, the Helpline will give you advice on how to proceed and suggest the right service to meet your need.

In the majority of cases you will need to pay for the work done by tradespeople. This may also involve the payment of a call out fee.

#### Insurance

The repairs that need to be undertaken on your property may be covered by insurance. First contact your insurance company if you think any damage to your home may be covered by your insurance policy.

### In the case of emergencies ring the toll free number 1800 80 1945.

A Defence Service Homes Loan can be used to help pay for repairs or modifications. However, in considering using a loan, you will need to be sure that the cost of the work justifies the expense of the loan and establishment fee and mortgage documentation.

The Helpline wherever possible, will link you to Government subsidised services such as Home Help and Handyman Services.

If you have a trades person call to your home, the Helpline staff may contact you by telephone or post to ensure that you are satisfied with the service arranged.

### **Entitlement Cards**

In the recent Budget, it was announced that simplification of DVA health care arrangements is a high priority. This will be implemented by reducing the current four card entitlement system to two.

The change will bring the health care eligibility of SPBC (*red card*) and DTEC (*lilac card*) holders into line with that of PTEC (*yellow card*) holder. This will be a major contribution towards simplifying the present system. The *white card* will remain unchanged.

The two card arrangements will be introduced from 1 January, 1996.
