SUBJECT: "Nurse Edith Cavell - Pioneer and Patriot".

Born the fourth child of a country G.P. at Banbury, Oxfordshire on 1st February, 1924, Dick was educated at Epsom College, Surrey and at the London Hospital Medical College in the East End of London.

After graduation and resident training he accepted a "short term" commission in the British Army of the Rhine for five years. He attained the rank of Major in the RAMC 2nd Field Ambulance. Having migrated to Australia in 1956 he worked as a G.P. in Kalgoorlie Boulder for eleven years then transferred to Fremantle for a further seventeen years.

Dick was appointed Director of Medical Services, Department of Veterans' Affairs in 1984 and retired in 1989. Unable to "hack" retirement the has gone back to work as a "locum" and fills his spare time as: Chairman, Board of Visitors, Lemnos and Bentley Hospitals;

Member of the Boxing Commission;

Life member and Medical Officer, South Fremantle Football Club; and (Sometime) member RSL State Executive.

Dick is well known to many of us through his regular attendance at Sub-branch luncheonmeetings and the ready fund of humorous stories with which he regales his friends from time to time.

(Nurse Edith Cavell was executed in Brussels by a German firing squad on 12 October, 1915, just eighty years ago on Saturday.)

WELFARE OFFICER'S REPORT

Health care arrangements for elderly Véterans.

The delivery of health care to Veterans and War Widows/Widowers is to be greatly simplified, with the number of DVA treatment entitlement cards being reduced from four (4) to two (2). Service Pensioner Benefit Card (SPBC - red card) holders and Dependant Treatment Entitlement Card (DTEC - lilac card) holders will have their entitlement upgraded to Personal Treatment Entitlement Card (PTEC - yellow card) level. The eligibility of holders of Specific Treatment Entitlement Cards (STEC - white cards) will NOT change. Service Pensioners' Benefit Card (SPBC - white card) holders will gain access to extended travel assistance and to the full range of pharmaceuticals under the Repatriation Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (RPBS). Dependent Treatment Entitlement Card (DETC - lilac card) holders will also gain access to the full range of pharmaceuticals under the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (RPBS) - they already have full travel assistance eligibility. IMPLEMENTATION DATE - 1 JANUARY, 1996.

Provision of chiropractic and osteopathic Services.

Access to chiropractic and osteopathic services will be available to entitled Veterans and War Widows/Widowers at Departmental expense on referral from Local Medical Officer. IMPLEMENTATION DATE - 1 SEPTEMBER, 1995 (Common question:

- Q. What is the view of the Australian Medical Association (AMA) on the use of chiropractic and osteopathic treatment?
- A. The AMA has publicly expressed some concerns about the general provision of chiropractic and osteopathic treatment.
- (N,B, The Local Medical Officers' Advisory Committee has indicated that Local Medical Officers would, generally, be happy with veterans access to these treatments given the safeguards of referral by LMOs.)
