

SUBJECT: Australian Football - From East Perth To The Dockers.

Ron Alexander was born in 1950, is married with three children and lives at Salter Point. He has worked as a teacher, sports administrator and manager but is undoubtedly best known for his involvement in the Australian Rules Football industry. Ron began his senior football career with East Perth Football Club in 1971 and in 1976 entered the VFL through selection for the Footscray club. In 1982 he returned to Western Australia where he became captain/coach of East Fremantle taking that club to three Grand Finals, winning the Premiership in 1985. He was appointed inaugural coach of the West Coast Eagles in 1987. He has played over 300 senior games and has represented both Western Australia and Victoria in interstate football. He was State coach of the Western Australian side which won the All Australian Championships in 1986 and was named All Australian coach by the National Football

Having completed the feasibility study for the entry of the second AFL team to come to Perth in June, 1993 he chaired interview panels for the appointment of coach and other senior positions. He is a Board Member as well as being Chairman of Selectors for the Fremantle Football Club (Dockers).

A Batchelor of Education, Ron has taught English, Physiculture and Social Studies atschools in Victoria and Western Australia, including two years teaching behavioral problem boys.

Appointments which Ron currently holds include:-

Board Member - WA Olympic Task Force (instigated by Hon. Norman Moore, Minister for Education, Sport and Recreation to secure oportunities for Western

Australia as a result of the Sydney 2000 Olympics); Board Member - WA Coaching Foundation (all sports);

President WA Football Coaches Association:

Chairman of Football Committee and Board Member Fremantle Football Club (Dockers):

Board Member - Western Australian Institute of Sport.

With such a depth of experience and knowledge behind him we look forward to a most interesting talk from a man who is fast becoming a football ikon in his own time.

The Sub-branch Committee members are often asked about the Honour Avenue Committee - How did Hoghgate get it? Who is on it? What do they do? etc. The RSL became involved with the work in the Kings Park Honour Avenues in 1922 when West Perth Sub-Branch was handed over some of the responsibilities by the Kings Park Board. West Perth later changed its name to the Public Service Sub-Branch which amalgamated with Press in 1973 and, in 1976 Public Service amalgamated with Highgate under the name of the latter. That, briefly, is how Highgate "inherited" the Honour Avenue Committee.

Work done by members involves the general maintenance of plaques and the posts on which they are placed. The Kings Park Board Staff look after the verges and replace trees etc.

- L (LES) STEWART (Member since 1991 Sub-branch President is in charge of making and fixing colour patches on the posts.
- K (KEN) WOOD (Member since 1995 will do anything. Recently involved with Secretary in checking Chris Brook's tapes with the Register of all plaques.

The Committee is currently checking the plaques with the Register. As mentioned they have all been put on tape and Les Stewart has arranged with the C.O. 11/28th Battalion to have a further check made. It is proposed as a communications exercise to have a radio

check done by having all the details of each of the plaques radioed to a central point and then checked with a computer printout from Head Office. When all is completed

copies of the printout of the Register will be given to the Kings Park Board, Kings Park Information Bureau, Guides of Kings Park and the Kings Park Rangers. The foregoing Kings Park authorities are frequently asked for details of plaques etc.
