PENSIONER CONCESSION CARD (CONTINUED): AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL RAIL:

You may be entitled to a reduced fare for travel between state capital cities. Full charges apply to sleeping berths and meals, where provided.

EASY ACCESS PARKING:

ACROD issue parking permits to people who are no longer able to use regular parking because of their disabilities. Permits are issued to individuals, regardless of age, based on a set of critera.

INTER - TOWN RAIL OR COACH FARES:

You are entitled to discount to a 50% discount on the basic fare on regular Westrail services in country areas. A 30% concession on the adult fare is available on privately operated bus services between WA towns. An additional concession is offered by some private operators.

<u>INTRA - TOWN BUS SERVICES:</u>

Concessions may be offered on privately operated bus services within country towns in WA up to 66% to the adult fare.

MOTOR DRIVERS LICENCE:

Pensioner Concession Card holders receiving a Service Pension from the Dept. of Veterans' Affairs who would, but for the Service Pension, be eligible for the age pension receive drivers licences free. All other Pensioner Concession Card holders are entitled to a 50% discount.

MOTOR VEHICLE LICENCE:

Most Pensioner Concession Card holders are eligible for a 50% concession on the licence fee for a motor vehicle renewal and exemption from the Third Party Insurance levy. This is subject to completion of an application form and production of their card. However they are NOT exempted from payment of Stamp Duty. A 100% concession, exemption from Third Party Insurance levy and Stamp Duty on transfer or initial registration of a vehicle is available to:-

Service Pensioners who are granted their pension on the grounds of invalidity (Sect. 37 of the VEA) and who are on the maximum rate of Service Pension. Applicants must provide a letter from the Department of Veterans' Affairs confirming their eligibility. There is a limit of one concession per person for any of the above.

PERTH TO MEEKATHARA:

The 'free trip' voucher may be used to undertake one free journey per year on 'Greyhound' or 'Pioneer' services between Perth and Meekathara or any place en route.

TAXI USER SUBSIDY SCHEME:

The scheme offers a 50% subsidy (to a maximum of \$25-00) to people who have severe and permanent disabilities when travelling in conventional or multi-purpose (wheelchair accessible) taxis throughout the State.

TRANSPERTH BUS, TRAIN AND FERRY SERVICES:

Concession fares are available on normal bus, train and ferry services. Your card must be shown to obtain the concession.
