PENSION (FORMERLY WELFARE) OFFICER'S REPORT:

Extended eligibility to Defence Service Homes (DHS) loans to widowers of WWII women.

<u>Initiative</u>: Veterans who have previously been assisted on their own service and are widowers of WWII ex-service women are currently not entitled to a second loan based on their status as widowers. This initiative removes that discrimination by allowing for entitlement to a second loan by WWII war widowers whose spouses are ex-service women.

<u>Background</u>: This measure addresses the unintended discrimination against WWII widowers who have previously used their own entitlement to DHS assistance. Widows of such veterans are presently entitled to such assistance.

Implementation Date: 1 January, 1997.

- (Q) To be eligible as the widower of a WWII ex-service woman under this measure, of what branch of the services must my wife have been a member?
- (A) Widowers of members of the following services will benefit from this initiative:-The Royal Australian Naval Service; The Australian Women's Army Service; The Women's Auxiliary Air Force; The Australian Army Medical Women's Service; and Full time paid members of the Voluntary Aid Detachment.

<u>ACCUMULATED FUNDS</u> - Increase of \$1229 in General Fund. A loss of \$814 in the Amelioration Account due to drop in Poppy sales and loss of \$8 in the Honour Avenue Fund. A donation of \$1000 to Legacy from General Funds decreased our funds available.

<u>INVESTED FUNDS</u>- Now stand at \$2422 at an interest rate of 8%. This deposit is part and parcel of our General Funds.

FUNCTIONS - Once again - well supported by Members.

<u>POPPY DAY</u> - Sales were down on last year of \$295 - but, conversely, expenses were down by \$295 also.

<u>AMELIORATION ACCOUNT</u>. All Poppy Day receipts and payments go through this account and any donations made by the Sub-branch must go to RSL welfare <u>AND NO OTHER</u>. Local donations, eg to Legacy, Red Cross etc. must come from General Funds Account.
