

RSL State Congress

Welcome Home March - Perth Friday 20 June 2003

From Defence Minister Robert Hill.

The public will have the opportunity to show their support for Australian Defence Force personnel deployed to the war against terrorism and the coalition to disarm Iraq at welcome home marches in June.

In Perth on Friday 20 June, the Prime Minister, Senator Hill and Chief of the Defence Force will join other dignitaries and well-wishers at the marches in recognition of the achievements, accomplishments and excellent work by the men and women of the ADF.

The marches are being conducted as soon as possible after the majority of personnel deployed to Operation Falconer return from the Middle East. They will be made up of ADF personnel and Defence civilians who contributed to Operation Slipper, Australia's contribution to the war against terrorism and Operations Bastille and Falconer, Australia's contribution to the coalition to disarm Iraq.

The Chief of the Defence Force recommended marches be held in Sydney and Perth, where most of the deployed forces are based, having regard to the need not to unduly interfere with post-deployment leave and family time for the returning personnel.

The marches will be similar to ANZAC Day parades, with formed groups carrying identifying banners marching through each city before attending civic reception. The concept is modeled on the welcome home marches conducted for the INTERFET forces on their return from East Timor.

"The marches will be the nation's opportunity to say thank you to the returning troops," Senator Hill said. "While we are holding private welcome home ceremonies for individual units around the country, these marches are a fitting opportunity for the general public to express their support and appreciation for the ADF. "It is important though not to forget our personnel who remain in the Middle East as part of Operation Catalyst - our contribution to stabilisation and recovery operations in Iraq. They are continuing to make a vital contribution in support of our national interest."

Our Guest Speaker for June is Dr Robert Pearce

Colonel Robert Pearce has been an active member of the Australian Army Reserve since 1970. In Western Australia he was RMO to 10th Light horse Regiment and commanded 7th Field Ambulance between 1978 and 1982. He has been consultant Surgeon to all three services in this Sate and last year he was appointed Honorary Colonel to the Royal Australian Army Medical Corps (RAAMC), which this year celebrates, it's Centenary. Dr Pearce has been in private practice as a Plastic Surgeon and Hand Surgeon in Perth since 1975. He held the appointment of Commissioner, St John's Ambulance in WA for six years and State Medical Officer of the Surf Life Saving Association for 12 years. He has been State Chairman of Save the Children Fund and Honourary French Consul. In 1990 he was awarded the AM for service to medicine and the community.

Last Month's Guest Speaker

Last month Mr Peter Fitzpatrick AM JP, CEO of the Motor Trade Association of Western Australia, was the guest speaker at our luncheon meeting. Peter's subject touched upon some issues in general with the petroleum industry and touched on petrol, diesel, pricing, ethanol and funny diesel the issue of problems facing small business in Australia.

Peter told us that Australia is competing in the use of petroleum products on the world stage. That the great multinationals control the industry all the way down the chain and in his view most of our politicians don't understand the issues involved and the effects on small business. Some possible solutions involve having the State Government introduce a maximum spot retail price for petrol because at the moment the situation can exist of the retail price at the pump being lower that the wholesale price. He continued to say that full transparency of prices at the oil terminal gate is needed statewide.

Jim Earys thanked Peter for his presentation and presented Peter with an invitation package to join Highgate together with a bottle of red in appreciation, on behalf of President Don Blair, committee and members of the Sub Branch. This was a very interesting and informative presentation.

Hollywood Clinic expands

Since opening six years ago, The Hollywood Clinic in Nedlands has offered a range of inpatient and day patient mental health services to privately funded patients and entitled veteran patients.

Redevelopment completed at the Clinic in September last year has added accommodation for an extra 10 patients, bringing the number of in-patient beds to 40.
